2019 C.O.A.L.S. Festival of Wreaths

Once again, strolls through the TAMU Leach Teaching Gardens will delight the residents of the Bryan/College Station area with colorful holiday displays throughout the gardens during the end of November and through December.

The C.O.A.L.S. Festival of Wreaths represents a special opportunity for student organizations at Texas A&M University and youth groups in the Bryan/College Station area to come together and contribute to the enhancement of the festive holiday setting in the gardens by decorating designated wreaths and competing in a friendly competition.

General Rules for Decorating

- 1. There are two divisions: collegiate and youth
 - a. The collegiate division will consist of any student organizations at Texas A&M University (i.e. student councils, fraternities and sororities, student government, ResLife, Fish Camp, Corps, etc).
 - b. The youth division will consist of any youth group in the Bryan/College Station area (i.e. 4-H, FFA, FCA, FCCLA, student councils, homeschool groups, church youth groups, schools, etc.)
- 2. The Event is limited to one entry per group. There is no entry fee. The submission of a completed Official Entry Form is required. Incomplete or illegible forms will not be accepted.
- 3. The theme of the wreath contest is "Holiday Songs." Groups are encouraged to select one song to base the wreath decorations on. Groups should specify which song they are representing when the wreath is turned in prior to judging.
- 4. Decorations should be created using recycled materials wherever possible. This is not required but strongly suggested.
- 5. Decorations must be designed for outdoor display and constructed to withstand all weather conditions. Paper, tinsel, and glass are strictly prohibited. Any prohibited materials will be removed prior to setup.
- 6. C.O.A.L.S. Council will provide a live wreath that is approximately 22 to 24 inches in diameter and a stand for the wreath. All other components must be provided by the groups.
- 7. Decorations must be securely attached to the wreath, not sit or be placed alongside the wreath. Decorations may hang from the wreath, be tied to the wreath, or be securely glued to the wreath. If a decoration falls off, it will not be replaced on the wreath.
- 8. When considering your decorations, please remember this is an event for people of all ages. Decorations may be funny, quirky, etc., but must be in good taste. The use of unusual recycled decorations is encouraged, but these items should also be in good taste and be able to withstand the weather. C.O.A.L.S. Council reserves the right to reject or remove any entry that fails to meet these standards or that is otherwise unacceptable or inappropriate.

- 9. Each participant may provide a sign not larger than 18" x 18" next to the wreath in order to identify the name of the organization that decorated the wreath and the theme of the wreath. With the exception of the identity of the group participating in the event and the theme of the wreath, no other information or messaging may appear on the participant's identification sign.
- 10. Participants should maintain their respective Christmas tree from the time of installation through the end of the Holiday Light Fight, a period of about two to three weeks. Any individuals from the participant entry group may be permitted to enter the TAMU Leach Teaching Gardens during posted hours of operation to inspect and/or maintain the participant's Christmas tree and ensure that it remains in good condition
- 11. College of Agriculture and Life Sciences Staff or associates may, from time to time, make repairs, replacements and/or adjustments on a wreath if the nature of the adjustment is apparent and the scope is limited, as they determine in their discretion; provided, however, participants remain ultimately responsible for ensuring that their respective Christmas tree remains intact, in presentable condition and in the position/placement as originally installed. Any entry deemed to be in poor condition may be removed.
- 12. C.O.A.L.S. Council and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences are not responsible for any damage or loss to any decorations at any time before, during or after the event.
- 13. The names, likenesses and images of participants and/or images of decorated wreaths, decorations and related aspects of the C.O.A.L.S. Holiday Light Fight event may be posted on C.O.A.L.S. Council website, Facebook page or other forms of media, and such images may be used in publicity or promotional communications or materials concerning the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and the Leach Teaching Gardens.
- 14. Wreaths will be available for pickup in front of the Leach Teaching Gardens from 3:00 PM 6:00 PM on Wednesday, November 20th, 2019. Finished wreaths will be dropped off in front of the Leach Teaching Gardens on Wednesday, December 4th, 2019 from 3:00 PM 6:00 PM. If a group is unable to pick up or drop off the wreath in this time frame, they should contact <u>coalscouncil@gmail.com</u> to receive further instructions.
- 15. In order to obtain approval for participation, participants must complete and submit an Official Entry Form by email that is received by C.O.A.L.S. Council no later than Wednesday, November 13th, 2019.
- 16. All Christmas wreaths will be located in the Leach Teaching Gardens. Participants shall receive a randomly-selected location for their wreath prior to set up dates.
- Participants agree to display and maintain their wreath displays through Friday, December 13th, 2019.
- 18. Wreaths, ornaments, and all other decor will be removed and disposed of by C.O.A.L.S. Council and the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences later in December. Please DO NOT use ornaments and decor that your organization wishes to have returned.

19. Entries will be judged by a panel of judges and through a people choice poll. Official judging for the panel will occur on Saturday, December 7th (6:00 PM – 8:00 PM) at the Maroon and White Merry and Bright event taking place in the Leach Teaching Gardens and the AgriLife Center. At least one member from each group will be required to attend this event. All organizations, community members, visitors, students, faculty, and staff are invited to attend. People's choice will be determined through an online voting system. Awards will be given for outstanding wreaths from each contest.
