What are The Gardens at Texas A&M University?


The first seven acres, the Leach Teaching Gardens, opened in 2018 with 21 demonstration gardens and a climatecontrolled pavilion. Twenty additional acres of landscape will ultimately be transformed into public gardens, and in future phases, walking trails will connect The Gardens to the George H.W. Bush Presidential Library and Museum.

What inspired The Gardens?

Texas A&M University is among the largest and busiest campuses in the nation. As the university grows, green space diminishes. To counteract this trend, in 1998 the Texas A&M University Board of Regents designated White Creek and the surrounding riparian area as the West Campus Greenway. The Gardens are a part of our commitment to green space where we engage the community in a living classroom.

Education and Discovery: Giving Opportunities

Help grow gardening skills! Your gift supports a variety of shared programs with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Service, the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, and other campus and community partners. Some examples:

- Lecture series on plant propagation and selection, water conservation, and more
- Specialty classes and tours in fruit trees, vegetable gardening, and pruning techniques
- Gardening 101, a class series on topics such as container gardening, basic lawn care, indoor plants, and more
- Hullabloomers, a children's education series featuring the Texas Parks & Wildlife Growing up Wild curriculum

Undergraduate Internships and Graduate Assistantships

Students in numerous Texas A&M University courses visit The Gardens as part of their classroom experience. These students' education is enhanced when donors support paid internships and graduate assistantships, which also benefit The Gardens. Students gain work experience in public garden management, horticulture, marketing and communications, or event and hospitality management, while Gardens operations gain valuable student perspectives and assistance.



K-12 Education

Join us in getting kids to go outdoors and learn! Donor funding allows us to provide education and outreach programs to children regardless of their family's ability to pay. For school tour groups, we offer a curriculum that supports TEKS standards in STEM fields. Students learn about literature, insects, parts of plants, and more. Donor support will help bring more students to The Gardens and nurture a love of plants, science, and nature.

We also partner with the Texas A&M AgriLife Extension Junior Master Gardener program, which uses gardening to ignite a passion for learning.
